HANDS-ON WORKSHOP

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

This two-day program is designed for dental professionals that are actively placing implants and would like to enhance both their surgical skills and understanding of evaluation of the dental implant patient. The program will include didactic presentations and hands – on exercises including the cadaver lab under the direct supervision of a surgical specialist. Primary goal is to assist each participant in achieving a higher level of clinical comfort with surgical extraction of teeth, design and manipulation of surgical flaps, placement techniques for dental implant fixtures, and proper suture techniques. The course will also include management of post-surgical infections and complications.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

At the completion of the program, participants should be able to:

- Confidently perform surgical extraction techniques
- Apply appropriate flap designs and suture techniques
- Perform socket grafting and ridge augmentation procedures
- Placement of implants in edentulous & immediate extraction sites
- Evaluate sinus for bone augmentation
- Perform traditional lateral sinus graft technique and crestal site preparation with osteotomes
- Navigate choices for membrane, graft materials, and biologics
- Identify pertinent surgical anatomy
- Plan for most common complications associated with dental implant surgery
- Understand medical history relevant to dental implant surgery including antiresorptive medications, anti-coagulants, etc.
