

# Reconstruction of the Maxilla and Mandible: Part II: Immediate Provisional Restoration

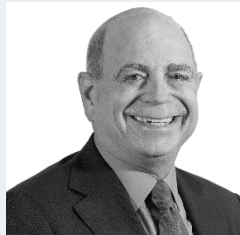
## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

This program is Part II of a two-part series demonstrating reconstruction of the maxilla and mandible. In Part I: Surgery, extractions of the remaining dentition and immediate placement of dental implants with simultaneous bone grafting was performed. This program is Part II, where a provisional prosthesis will be fabricated and inserted to provide the patient with immediate restorative function of the dentition. The aim of this program is to provide participants with a view of clinical procedures performed by highly-skilled clinicians who will explain and showcase advanced surgical and restorative techniques, helping participants to implement them into their practices. Given the cutting-edge nature of the procedures and services presented in these programs, participants will be given the ability to watch the clinical procedures, then participate in an interactive question and answer session about the techniques performed.

- List the components needed for fabrication of immediate full-arch provisional prostheses inserted on the day of implant placement.

- Understand the prosthodontic and laboratory procedures that will be required for the design and fabrication of the definitive prostheses.
